The report, which brings together evidence collected during the HYPERLINK "http://www.eua.be/euima" <a href="EUIMA project">EUIMA project</a> and from previous HYPERLINK "http://www.eua.be/eua-work-and-policy-area/governance-autonomy-and-funding/financial-sustainability.aspx" <a href="EUIA work on funding">EUIA work on funding</a>, provides an update on the status of full costing implementation in 14 <a href="European higher education systems">European higher education systems</a>. It examines the impact of full costing on the relationship between universities and different funders and highlights the role of the FP7 reimbursement model as a driver for full costing development across Europe. The report concludes that, overall, considerable progress has been made in recent years in the implementation of full costing, while a number of internal and external obstacles still exist.
